- Refrain from, and refuse to tolerate any form of bullying
- Develop mutual trust and respect with every player to build their self-esteem
- Encourage each player to accept responsibility for their own behaviour and performance
- Ensure all activities I organise are appropriate for the players' ability level, experience, age and maturity
- Co-operate fully with others in football (e.g. officials, doctors, physiotherapists, welfare officers) for each player's best interest

Dear Parent/ Guardian,

The manager of your son/daughter's Eagles team may have already have advised you that the annual subscription for 2009/10 season has increased by £5 compared to last season.

This is due to rising costs and the need to constantly improve our facilities. Over the coming weeks contractors will be installing more rabbit proof fencing to improve the playing surface of the intermediate size pitch nearest the Baldock Road, and trimming the hedge along the Baldock Road boundary. I am also obtaining estimates to extend the area of surfaced car parking for next season.

Unfortunately our attempts to fund raise in order to keep subs down has not been a great success. The sponsored mini soccer tournament run by Jeff Hutchison in May was poorly supported and the Awards evening events such as the raffle raised less than last year. Refreshment profits are also down because of the bad weather at the beginning of the year.

I realise that family budgets are under pressure this year, but we have to ensure that the club remains solvent. Any family suffering financial hardship should advise the team manager, who will refer a request for financial support to the club welfare officer. We have a fund to help in these circumstances.

The club also encourages parents to visit the FA web site and complete a Respect Guide course on line. That course is free and deals with issues such as unacceptable touchline behaviour and respect for referees and players. It replaces the Soccer Parent course. The club has decided not to make completion of the course mandatory this year but we do ask you to view the course if you have access to a computer.
